#### 1. Dominion Energy

Scott Reamy will speak about Dominion's project at the Glebe Substation on Four Mile Run - which includes updating aging infrastructure and removing the overhead line. The project timeline is anticipated to be 3-4 years (2-3 years of construction).

#### 2. AHCA Budget
