Pentagon City Development Ramps Up

Yet another development proposal has been submitted, this one to raze two office 12-story buildings across from the Pentagon City metro and replace with a mix of four office and residential buildings up to 26 floors high. Combined with Pen Place, Met Park, and Crystal House, this is now the fourth major redevelopment proposal this year. Together, these will fundamentally change the Pentagon City skyline, but they can also have positive and negative impacts to livability qualities like housing costs, transportation, school needs, public safety, trees, and air quality. Be sure to come hear and talk to the Planning Commissioners at this month's meeting to understand how the county and residents can influence these changes.



Branding for "National Landing" Area

The Crystal City BID invited representatives from AHCA and the Crystal City Civic Association to a meeting to discuss the branding effort for the new Amazon-centric development. The BID has hired Pentagram, the design consultants who marketed the High Line and Hudson Yards in NYC. It looks as though "National Landing" is here to stay, though residents who attended pointed out the need to keep the neighborhood names and to focus on how to integrate the different communities better. Pentagram and the BID will be holding further meetings in May.

Loss of a Champion

Our neighborhood lost a champion last month. A magnificent White Oak tree came down, taking another oak with it, on the grounds of Our Lady of Lourdes church. The tree, 110 feet tall and 184 feet in circumference, was listed as a County Co-Champion for its girth, height, and crown spread, tying two others. It probably was over 200 years old, already mature when the Civil War ended. The surviving champs can be seen in north Arlington at the corner of 16th and N. 
Possible Black Box Theatre in Crystal City
